

# Campus Internet Access

**Welcome to Princeton University.** As a visitor to our campus, please feel free to access our Visitor Wireless Service from your personal computer, iPhone, or BlackBerry device. Visitor Wireless service is extended to all short-term visitors and is available in all wireless areas across campus.

**Note:** Use of the Visitor Wireless Service constitutes your agreement to abide by the University's acceptable use policy. Once you access the Internet, please see Princeton's IT use policies at [www.princeton.edu/itpolicy](http://www.princeton.edu/itpolicy).

To get started using Visitor Wireless:

1. **Verify that you are in a wireless service area.** Check your wireless network signal for Princeton University's visitor wireless network, **puvisitor**.
2. **Connect to the puvisitor wireless network.** Configure your wireless network settings to access **puvisitor**. Instructions for the current computer operating systems and iPhone and BlackBerry devices follow.

## From your computer...


### In Windows Vista/Windows 7:

- Click the **Start** button, then click **Connect To** (Windows 7, click the Network icon).
- Click the **puvisitor** Wireless Network Connection.
- Click the **Connect** button.

### In Windows XP:

- Click **Start** in the Start Menu.
- Select **Connect To**. (For computers set to use the Classic Start Menu, select **Settings, Network Connections**.)
- Right-click on **Wireless Network Connection**, and select **View Available Wireless Networks**.
- Select **puvisitor** from the list of available wireless networks.
- Click the **Connect** button.

### In Mac OS X:

- Click the AirPort  status icon in the menu bar.
- Select **puvisitor** from the list of available wireless networks.

## From your iPhone...

Your iPhone connects to the Internet through its AT&T service without any intervention. You can alternately configure your iPhone to connect to Princeton's visitor wireless network. To do so:

- Tap **Settings** > **Wi-Fi** from the iPhone home screen.
- Set Wi-Fi to **ON**.
- Select **puvisitor** from the network list.

**Note:** If a connection to puvisitor is not established, select puwireless from the network list, then tap **Forget this Network**. Wait two minutes and connect to puvisitor again.

## From your BlackBerry...

If you own a BlackBerry device, no connection to the Princeton wireless network is necessary. You use the service provided by your carrier to access the Internet.

Reception on campus has recently been significantly improved, though you may experience weaker reception in older campus buildings.

### Helpful Hints:

- Ensure that your wireless card is set to obtain its IP information via DHCP.
